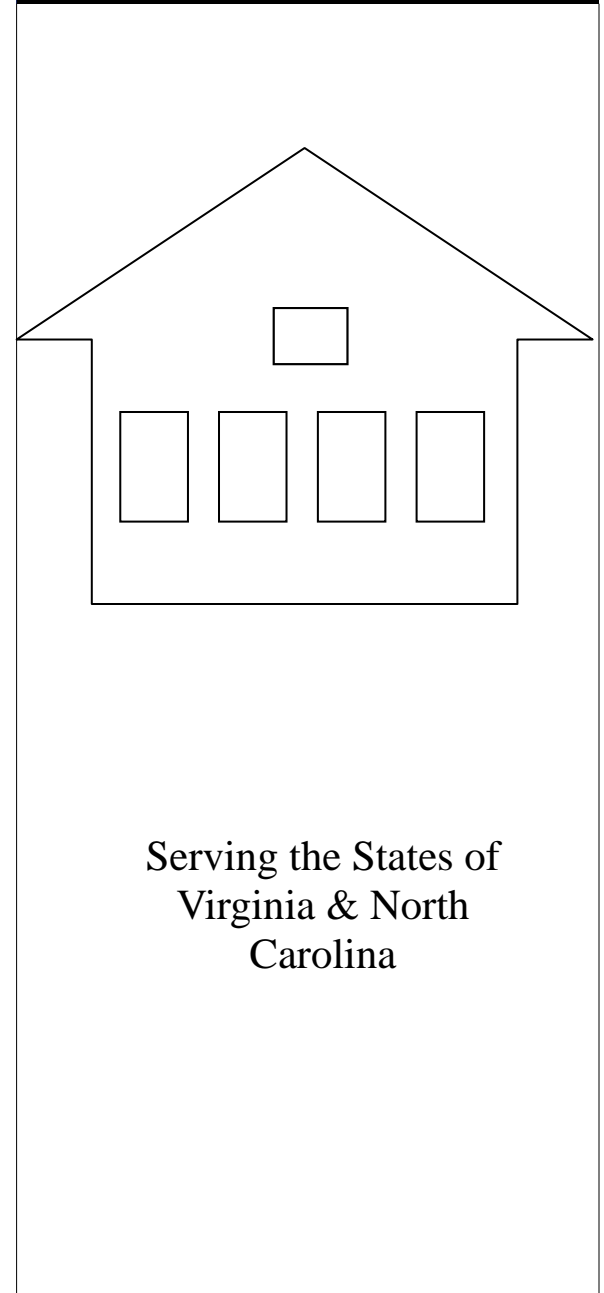
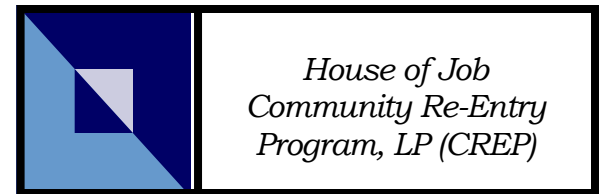

Admission Process:

Call House of Job/CREP business office at (434-634-2974) for detailed instructions. Call well before admission is anticipated - we generally have a waiting list.

Admission Criteria:

We accept referrals from a variety of sources, including:

Self-referrals
Treatment Facilities
Probation Officers
Parole Officers
Pre-trial services

Referrals will be screened for needed services.

Referrals must be physically capable of full-time employment, unless receiving other substantial income. Those individuals receiving disability income will be required to perform volunteer work at a local service organization.

Candidates with dual diagnosis issues must be stabilized, have prearranged appointments with mental health providers and must have a renewable source for medications.

Candidates must have a strong desire to achieve personal recovery from addiction and all other issues.

All admissions at HOJ/CREP are considered voluntary unless individuals are court mandated.

HOJ/CREP serves individuals without regard to race, color, sexual orientation, national origin, religious preference, age (18 and over), disability, marital status, or economic status.
